Best Fund-Raiser

Our best fund-raiser, by far, has been the Avenue of the Flags. We are just starting our 2nd year for this program and we know that we will make quite a bit of money from it. We had heard about it for several years through the District Optimist Conferences, but we were hesitant to try it.

Ironically, we became involved in the program through our local Lions Club in Perry. The Lions had heard about it also and the Lions Club in Adel (25 miles from Perry) has had a huge success with it over the years. So, the Lions Club in Perry asked us to partner with them on the project. We are both fairly small clubs, so having extra people-power made sense when undertaking such a potentially huge project. We discussed it at a couple of meetings and finally decided to approve the joint project with the Lions Club.

We concentrated on two of our main streets in Perry (population 8,000). We wanted Willis Avenue and 2nd Street to be our focus and we tried to get as many flags sold on those two streets as we could. And, we were successful in getting a large number of flags sold on those two streets. Once people saw how beautiful the flags looked on our first holiday (Memorial Day), we sold a bunch more on various other streets in town. We continued to sell more flags after each holiday. Currently, we have over 225 flags and we expect to be over 300 later this summer.

As a fund-raiser, we share in the profits with the Lions Club. It is the most successful fund-raiser that either club has done in the past and it really helps emphasize patriotism for our great country, the USA. And, it demonstrates that service clubs can work together for the benefit of the community.
